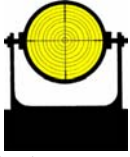
I think there will be many changes coming from International and only understanding, consideration and co-operation will make everything work. We are still fighting to make this Lodge a FAMILY CENTER.


